


The Charrette System Phases


What is a NCI Charrette?

Charrette Work Cycles



Charrettes Produce Feasible Detailed Solutions



Charrette System Strategies

- 1. Work collaboratively
- 2. Design cross-functionally
- 3. Compress work sessions
- 4. Communicate in short feedback loops
- 5. Study the details and the whole
- 6. Produce a feasible plan
- 7. Use design to achieve a shared vision and create holistic solutions
- 8. Conduct a multiple day charrette
- 9. Hold the charrette on or near the site




