

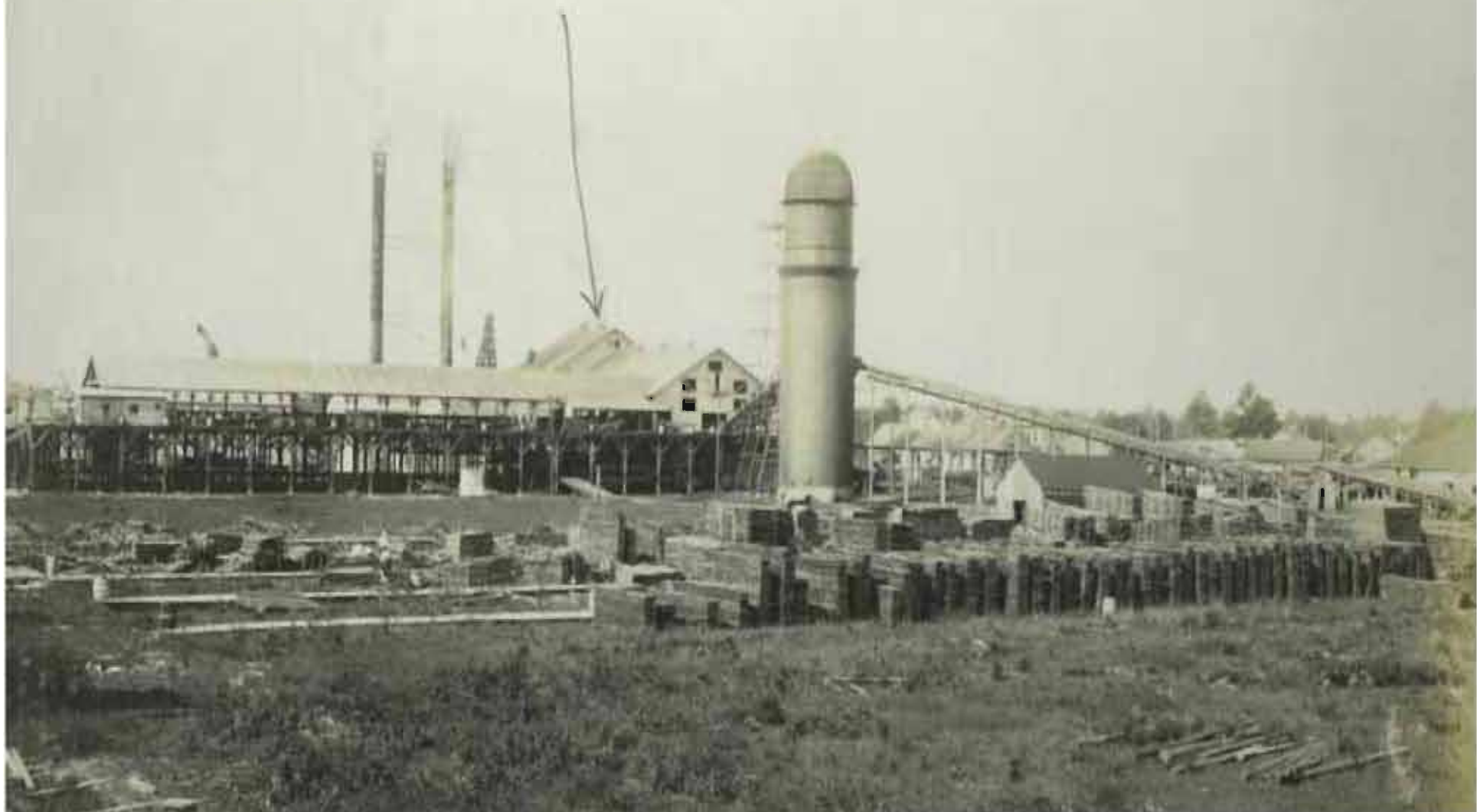


The Waccamaw Lumber Company, Circa 1912

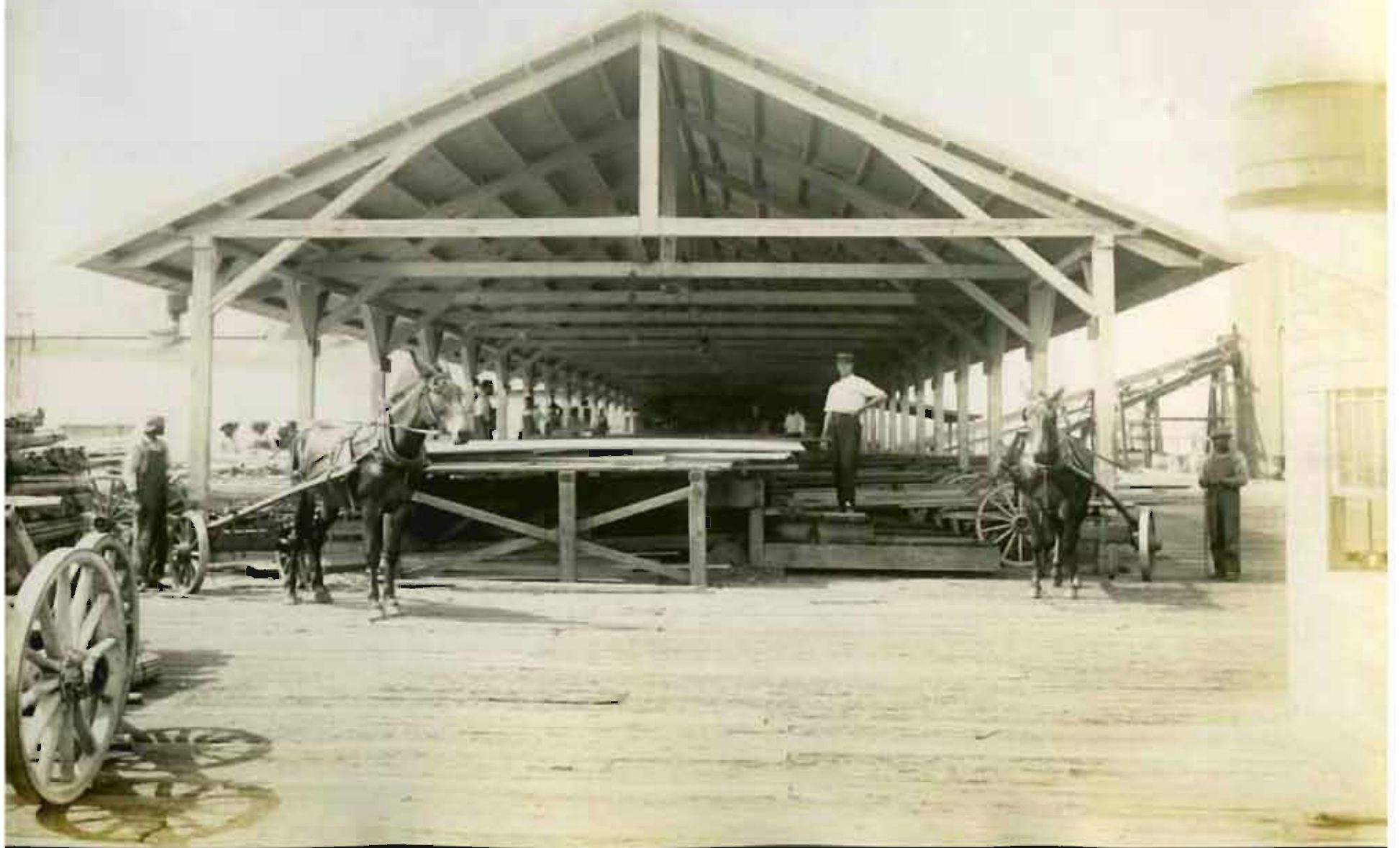


Most of the able bodied men worked in the Saw Mills.

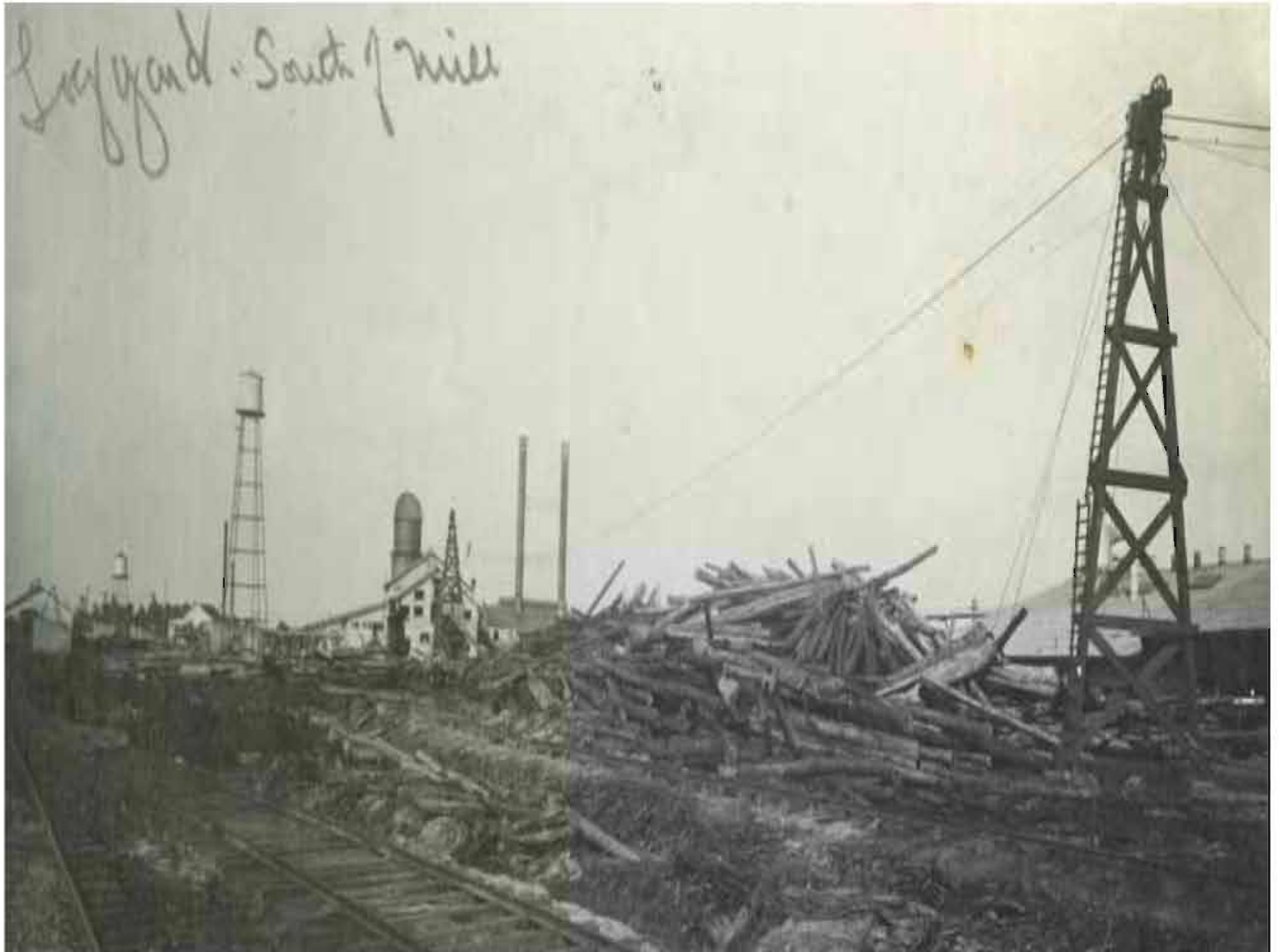
Saw Mill destroyed by fire 1916

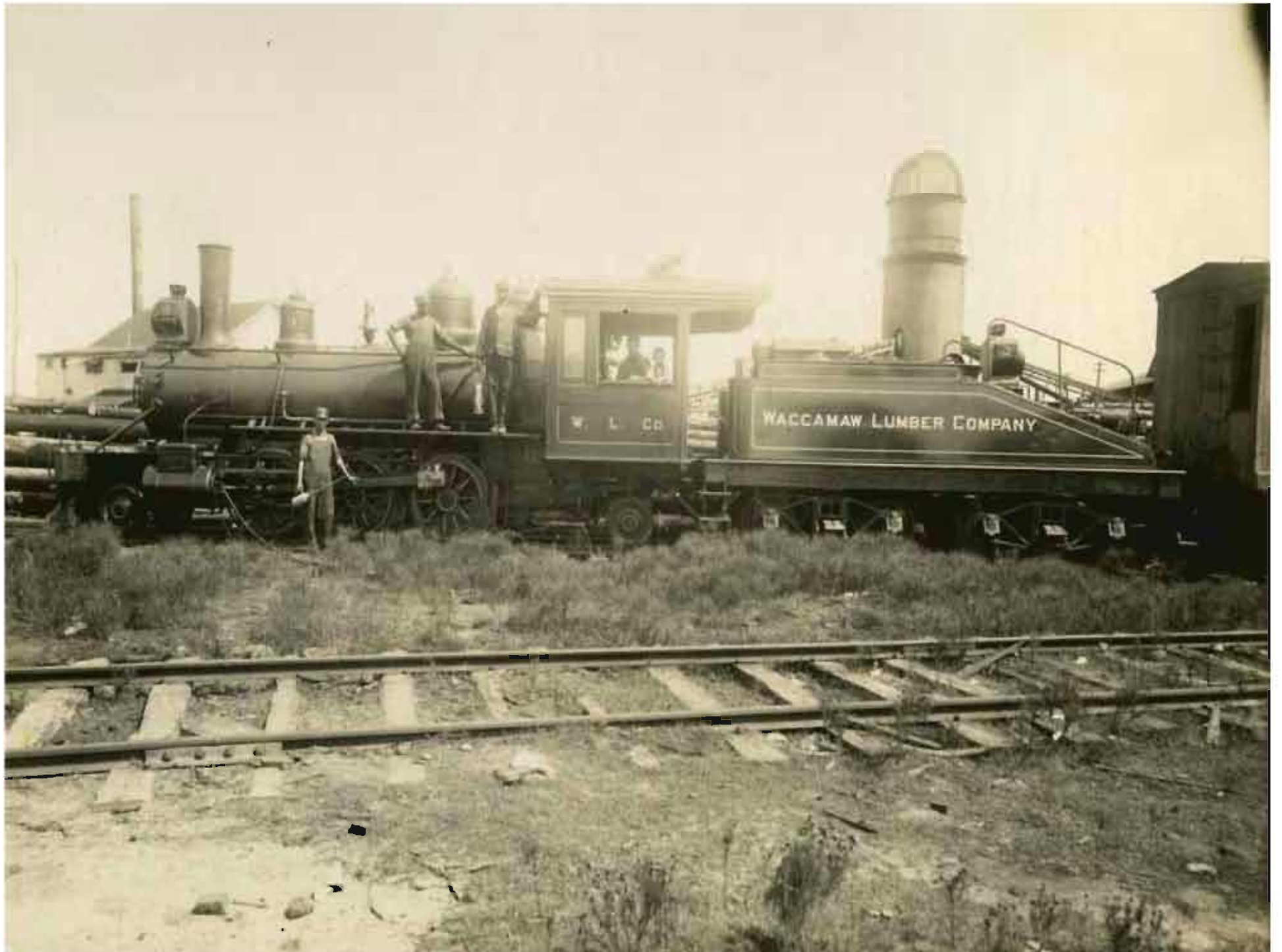














Camps such as this one were called “CC Camps”.

Mayor Frank Wilson saw a great need for affordable health care in Bolton. Many residents were sick and some even died from preventable causes. Because health care was approximately 20 miles away, residents had to prepare to go. They had to secure transportation, babysitting services, money, etc, it was like going on an overnight trip.

Mayor Wilson met with UNC-W, and others and The Bolton Health and Wellness Center was the outcome. Later, Goshen took over the day to day operations of the medical center and it was renamed Goshen Medical Center, Inc.

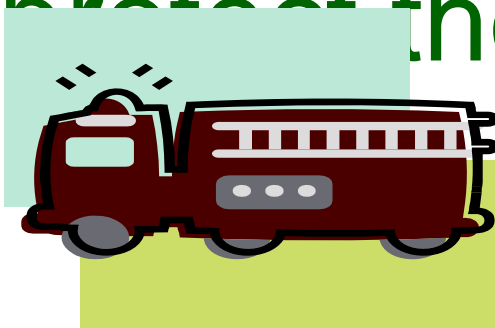

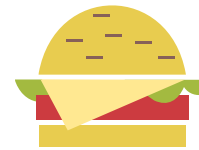

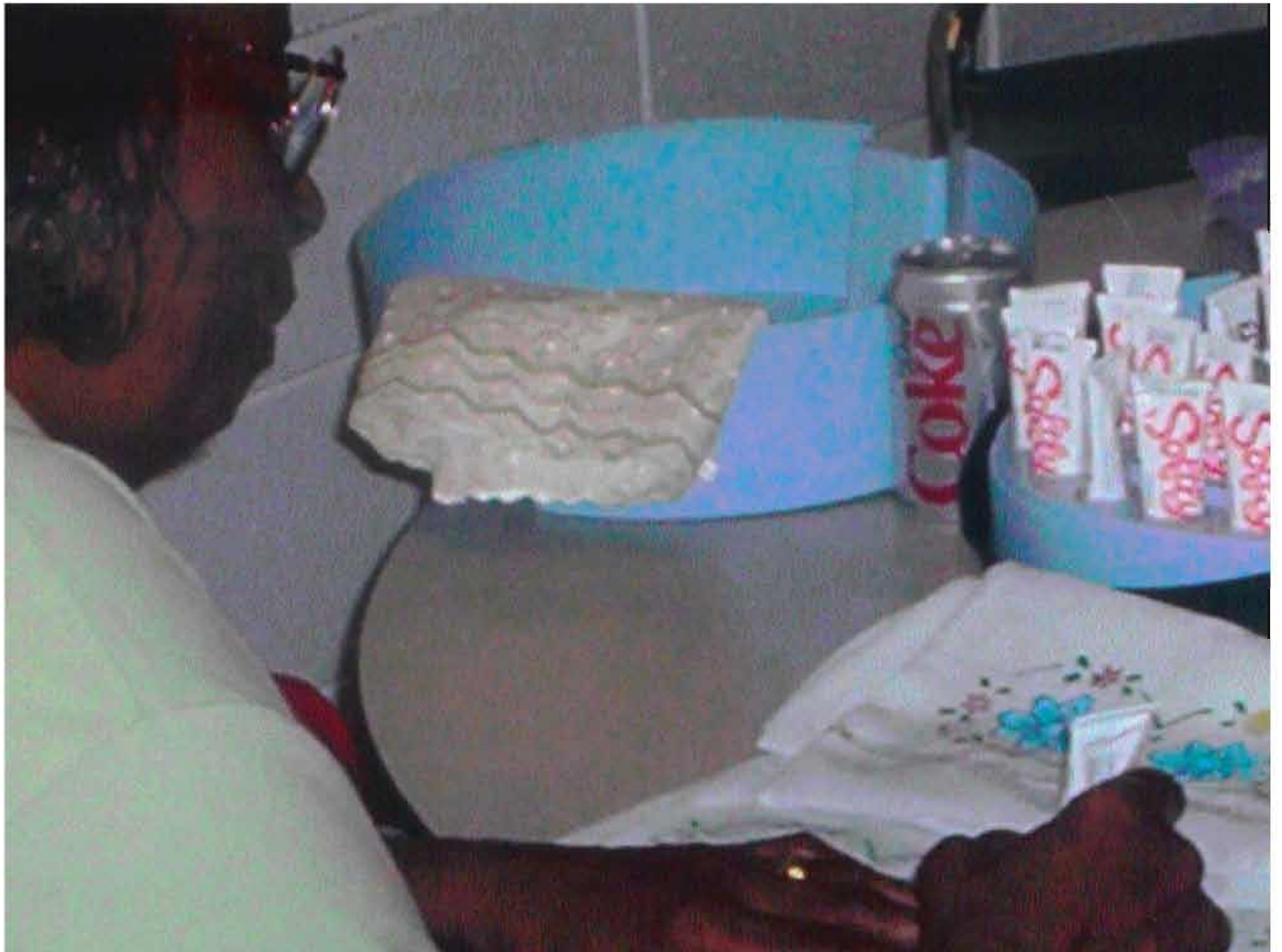

Bottom Safe Haven After School Program

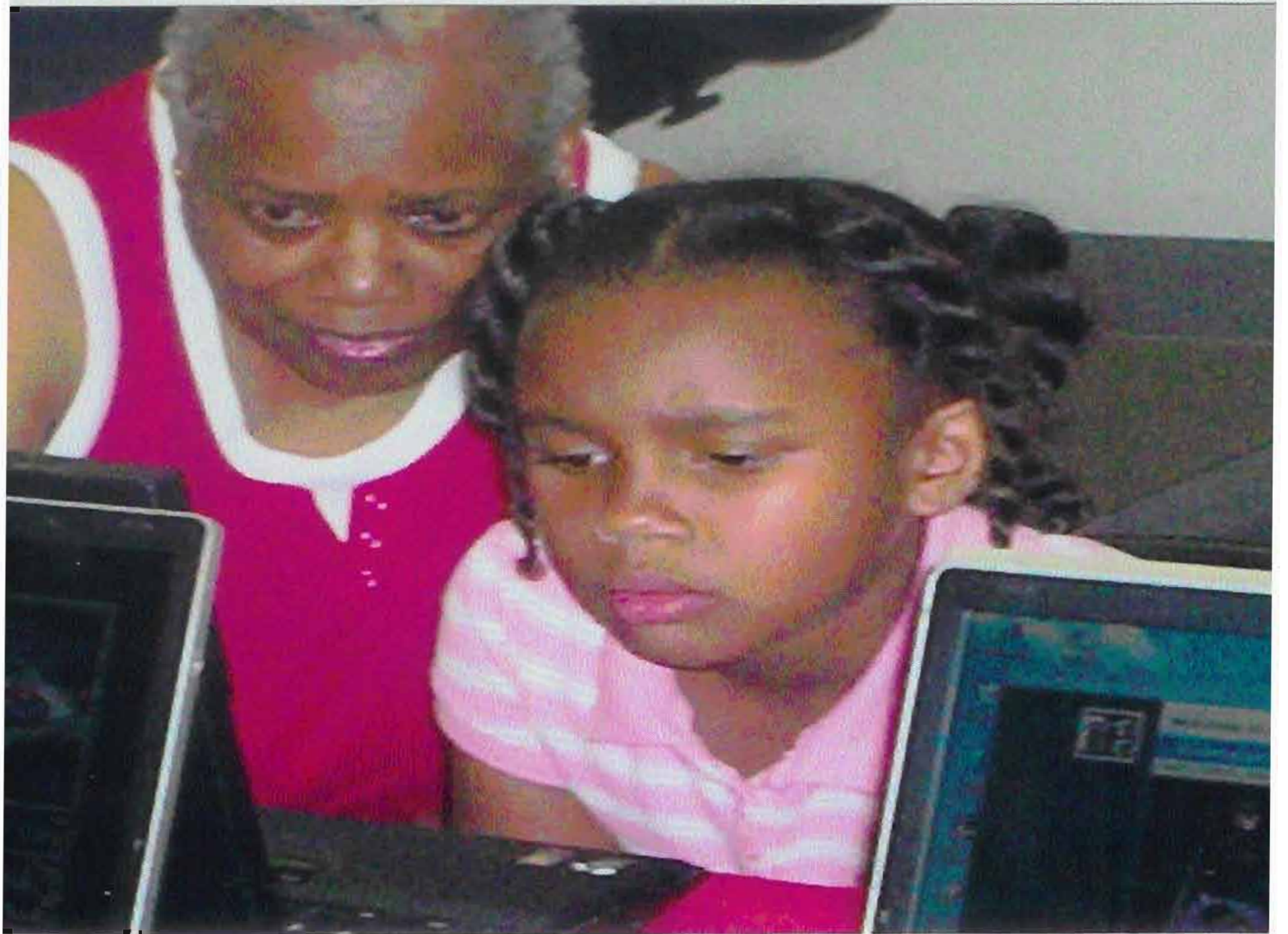

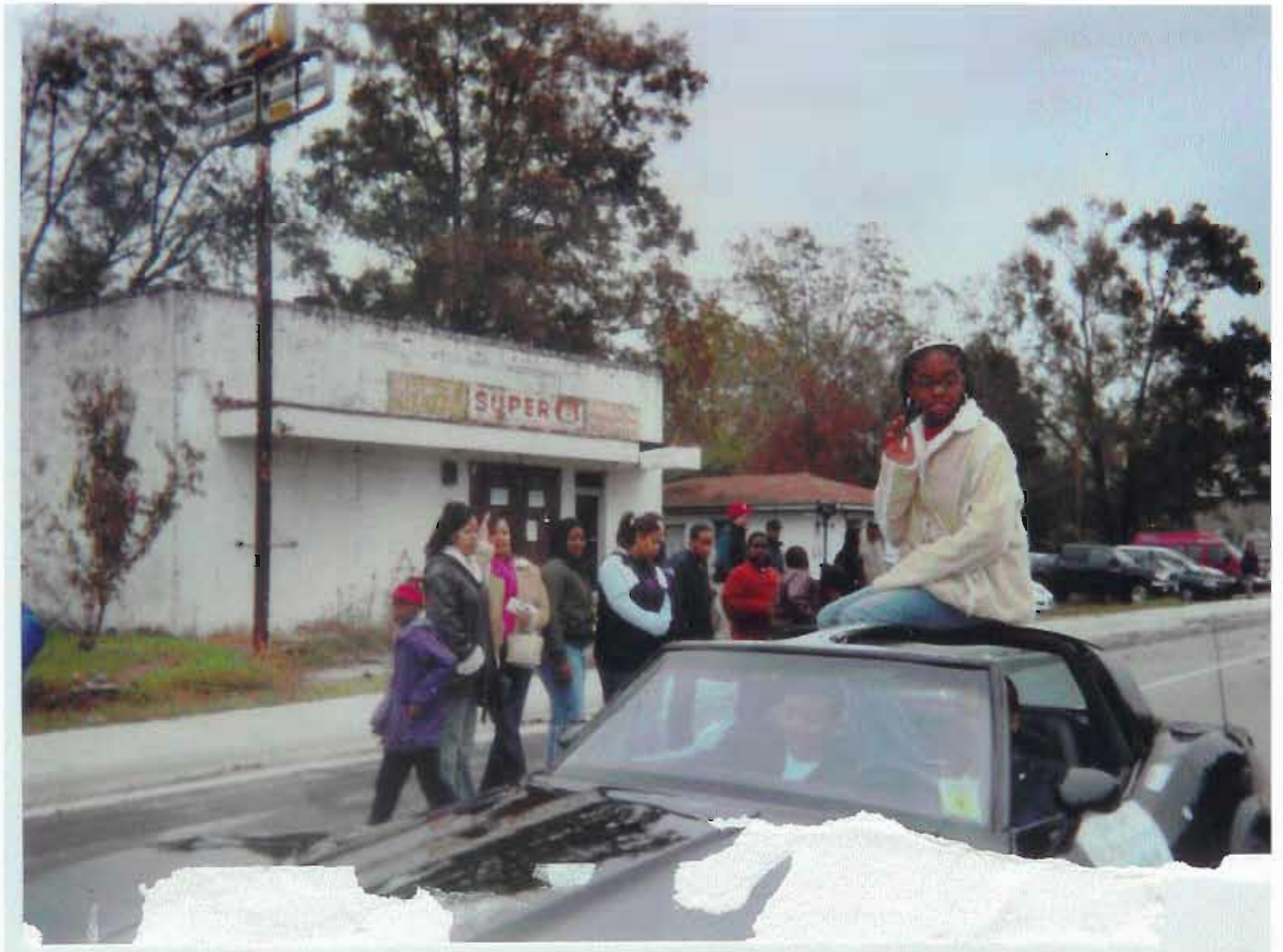
The Festival and Parade brings people from all over North Carolina and surrounding states. We have food and craft vendors, musicians, clowns, etc.

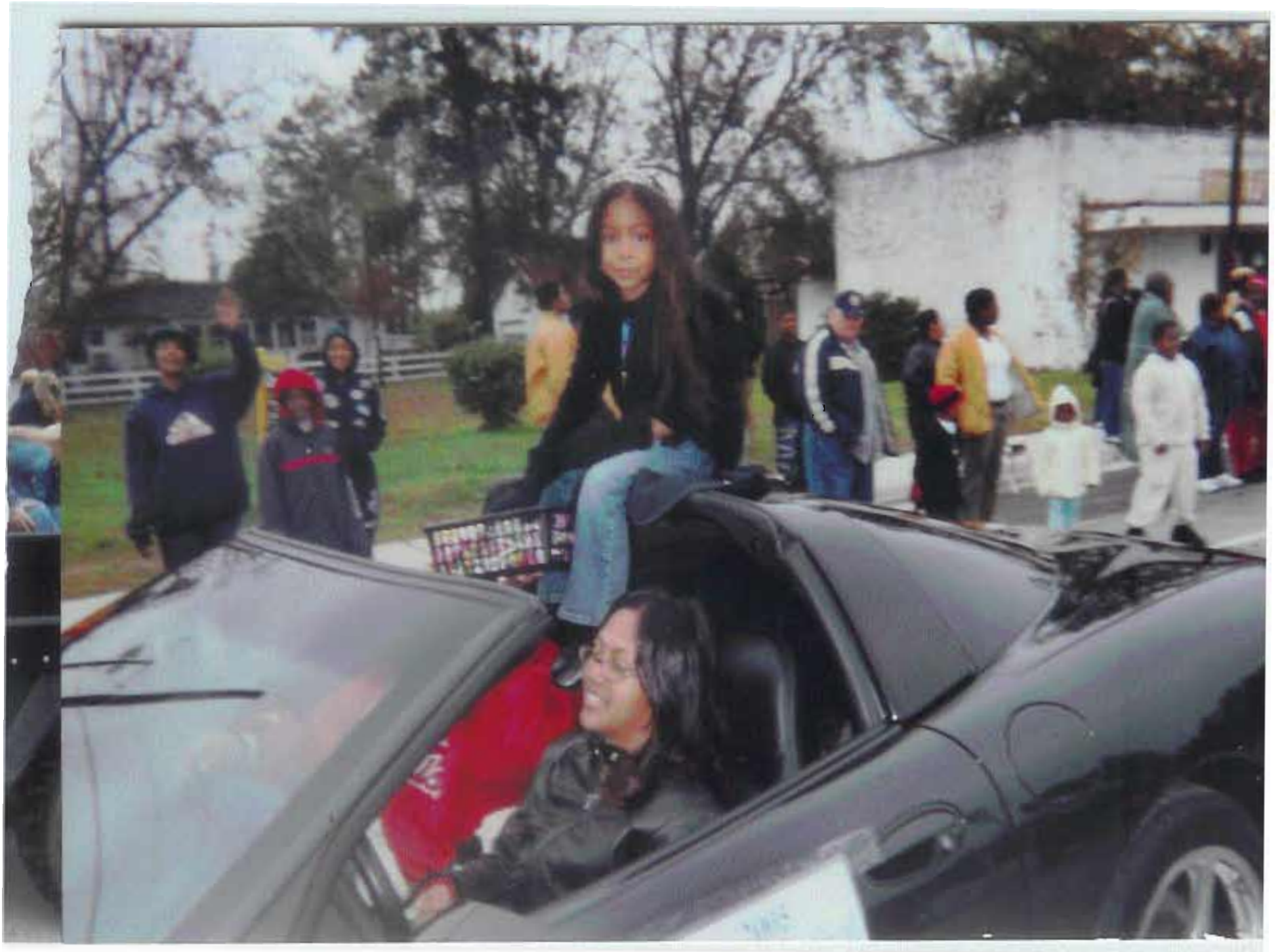
















**Here come the

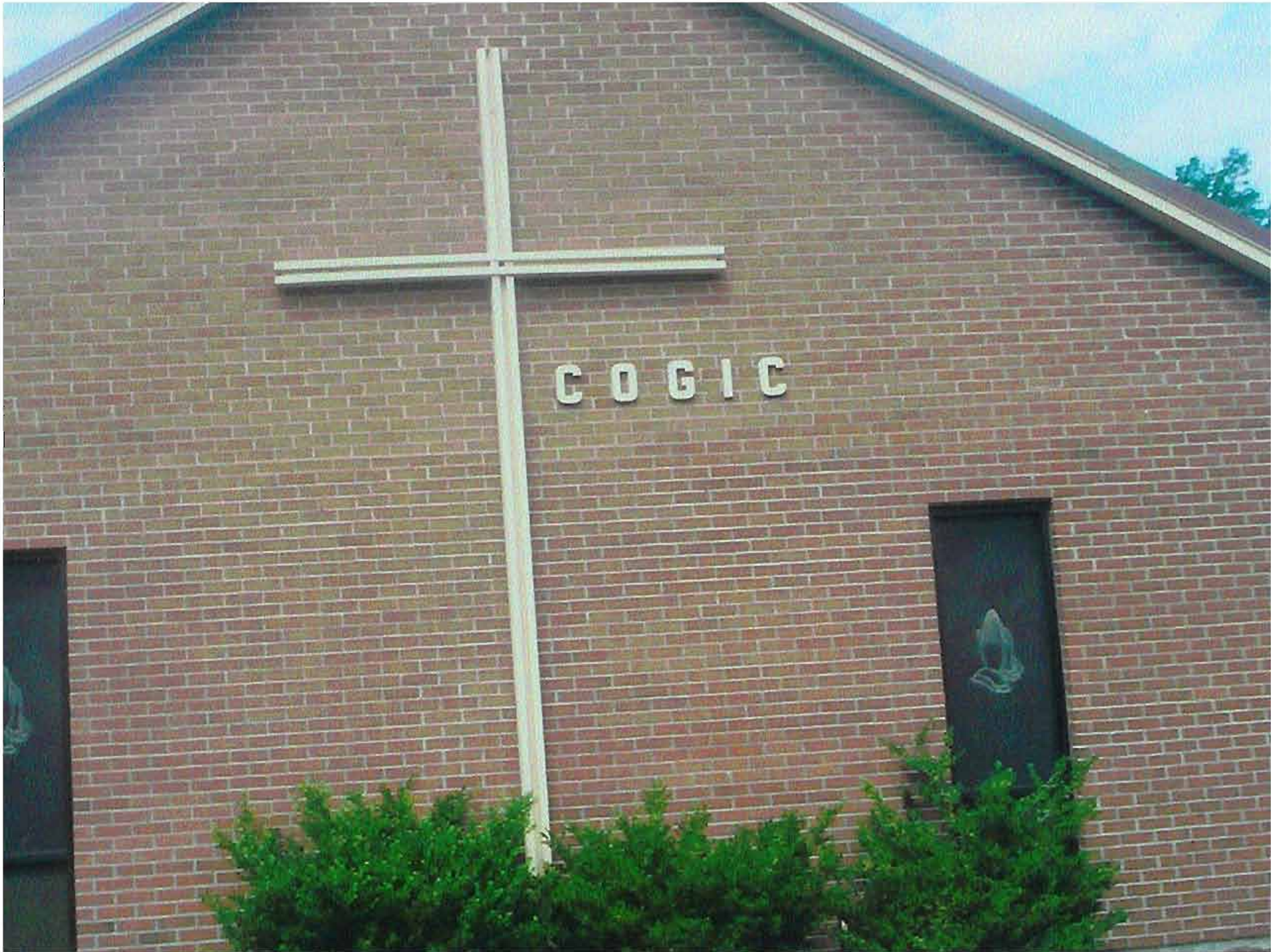

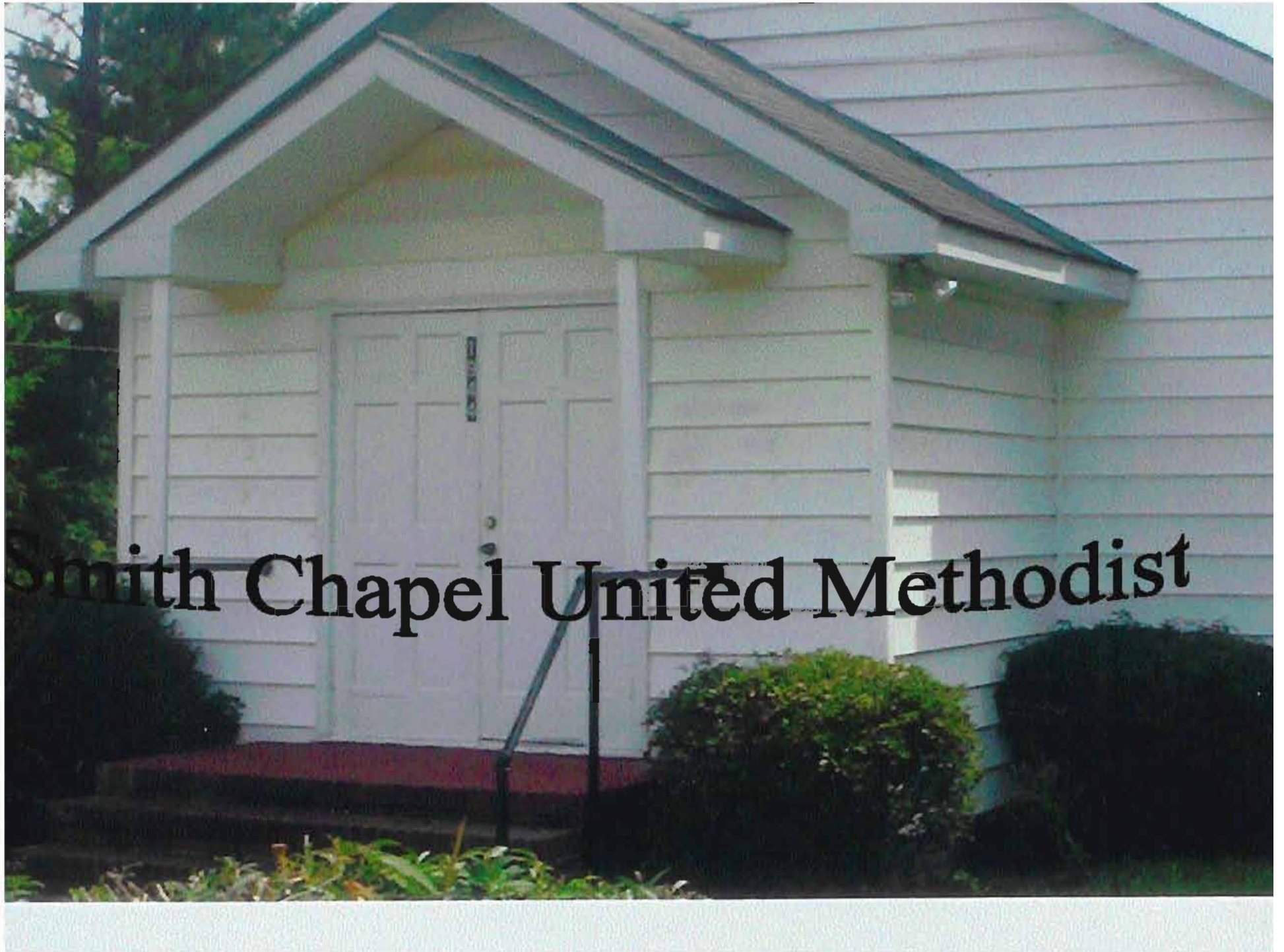
