


Strategies:

- ***Think medium term** but look for continual short-term success





The Missouri Way *Local control; State never dictates *MoDOT is an independent 4th branch of govt *Always be polite and persuasive vs. confrontational



Focus on Decision Makers – Bike Delaware lessons learned:

- + Focus on state elected officials (Governor and legislature)
- + Don't focus on just state bike/ped coordinator. Have relationships with the Transportation Secretary and every major department head.
- + If you have a chance, try to influence the selection of your **next DOT Secretary**
- + Politics is more important than policy
- + Partner with public health advocates if you can
- Focus on the state budget process for authorization (because your DOT sure does)




- **Steps towards statewide Complete Streets**
 - + Early 1990s: No MoDOT bike/ped policy. Refused TE, bike/ped coordinator.



- + Late 1990s: Rudimentary bike/ped policies
- + Early 2000s: Improved bike/ped policies
- 2005: MoBikeFed hires lobbyist




- **Steps towards statewide Complete Streets**
 - + 2007: 3 Complete Streets policies in MO
 - + 2007: MoBikeFed Vision specific CS goal
 - + 2008: Statewide Complete Streets bill introduced
 - + 2009: Again
 - + 2010: Again

 - *2008 5 policies
 - *2010 13 policies






Meanwhile

+2008-present: MoDOT funding crisis

- × ~\$1 billion new annual funding needed
- × Meetings
- × Lobbying



- × Specific goals/requests including Complete Streets
- × Message: We cannot support new MoDOT funding unless.



Steps towards statewide Complete Streets

- + Late 2009: MoDOT Director requests meeting
- + 2010: Missouri Complete Streets Resolution
- + 2010: MoDOT/MoBikeFed Bike/Ped Projects List
- + 2010: Hugely improved MoDOT ped/ADA policies
- + 2010: Majority in MO support superstrong "25% Complete Streets"
- + 2011: MO Chamber of Commerce supports bike/ped spending
- + 2011: \$13 million MoDOT bike/ped funding








What's Next?

 - ST: A few small/rural cities
 - 0% of counties have a policy
 - ×LT: All counties
 - < ST: ?


