# California's Path to a Low Carbon Future

Planning is very hard. Implementing is harder.

- June 1, 2005 Executive Order S-3-05:
- By 2010, reduce GHG emissions to 2000 levels
- By 2020, reduce GHG emissions to 1990 levels
- By 2050, reduce GHG emissions to 80 percent below 1990 levels

- September 27, 2006 Global Warming Solutions Act (AB 32)
- Identify the level of GHG emissions in 1990 for limit in 2020
- Air Resources Board shall prepare and approve a scoping plan
- Adopt market-based declining annual aggregate GHG limits for categories of sources applicable January 1, 2012 (cap and trade)

- September 30, 2008 Sustainable Communities and Climate Protection Act (sв 375)
- ARB sets regional targets for each region covered by an MPO
- MPO must create a "sustainable communities strategy" along with an RTP which together meets the regional target
- Developers of projects conforming with strategy can get some regulatory relief

- September 30, 2008 Sustainable Communities and Climate Protection Act (**SB 375**)
- Identify the level of GHG emissions in 1990 for limit in 2020
- Air Resources Board shall prepare and approve a scoping plan
- Adopt market-based declining annual aggregate GHG limits for categories of sources applicable January 1, 2012 (cap and trade)

- February 12, 2010 Sustainable Communities Planning Grant and Incentive Program
- Three rounds of grants totaling \$60 million for planning
- Current focus on readiness to implement, efficiency in carbon reduction and EJ commitment
- Third round deadline February 28, 2014
