


Scope

- Phase 1
 - 2 mile modern streetcar
 - Downtown only
 - Operational in 2015
- Phase 2
 - Up to 10 additional miles
 - Extending south & east of downtown line
 - Operational by 2020

Phase 1 Funding

- Special district (TDD)
- Small Federal grants
- Local public improvement fund & cost overruns
- Zero state funding



Phase 1 - Local

- Transportation Development District
 - Raises \$73.5 million of \$102 million project cost
 - Authorized by state statute
 - Lobbied for tweaks specific to streetcar in 2011
 - Approved by mail-in vote in 2012
 - Special assessments & sales tax within the district to fund capital/operations
 - Assumed NO growth in value or retail sales
 - City backing debt & cost overruns

Phase 1 - Local


- Local funding covered environmental analysis and engineering
 - \$2.5 million allocated in 2012
 - \$1 million surplus TIF
 - \$1 million PIAC
 - \$500,000 from in-district
 - Other council districts chipped in \$100,000 each
 - \$500,000 from transit agency

Phase 1 - Federal

- Multiple small federal grants
 - TIGER I, denied in 2010
 - First attempt to kick-start feasibility
 - Alternatives Analysis, granted in 2010
 - \$500,000, completed AA in record time (9 mo)
 - TIGER IV, denied in 2012
 - Locally programmed via MPO, granted in 2012
 - Surface Transportation Program (\$16 million for vehicles)
 - CMAQ (\$1.1 million for stations)
 - TIGER V, granted in 2013
 - \$20 million covered cost overrun and reduced bond issuance
 - Had applied for TIGER IV before local funding in place and was denied
 - Only streetcar project funded in TIGER V


Phase 1 - State

- Zero state funding
 - Constitution prohibits using gas tax revenue for transit (roads/bridges only)
 - State funding for transit lower than all adjacent states (2011 data)



Phase 2 Funding

- Local Larger district to go before voters in August
- Federal Will apply for New/Small Starts
- State Zero state funding at this time
