



Canal Walk - Holyoke, MA






Fairmount/Indigo Boston: Uphams Corner Station Area, Before and After



The Fairmount Indigo Transit Corridor Community Demographics

- 9-miles of transit that connects Dorchester, Roxbury, Mattapan and Hyde Park
- Varied, but densely populated, urban neighborhoods
- ~90,000 people live within 1/2mi of existing and proposed transit stations
- Median household income of that population is ~\$17K less than the regional average
- High concentration of lowincome, immigrant and minority households.
- Nearly 50% of households do not own a car.



HUD-DOT-EPA Sustainable Communities Partnership

HUD, DOT, and EPA are supporting the Fairmount Collaborative in their transit-oriented development (TOD) planning to:

- clean and redevelop brownfields
- help minimize displacement of existing residents,
- create jobs and recreational opportunities for those residents,
- encourage development of affordable housing.





Partnership Assistance

Sustainable Communities Pilot, 2010

- \$110K in technical assistance for the Fairmount Collaborative was awarded by EPA's Office of Brownfields and Land Revitalization, Office of Sustainable Communities, and Office of Underground Storage Tanks
- Explored potential support and technical assistance from non-federal partners such as the Trust for Public Land and Habitat for Humanity
- EPA, HUD, and DOT staff time and support as well as technical assistance from consultants
